Saturday, May 20 arrive Copenhagen, Denmark

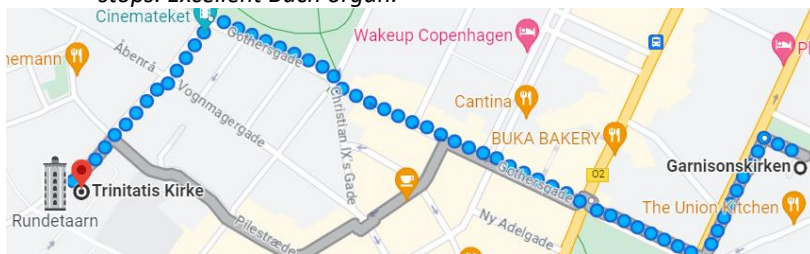
For those arriving into Copenhagen prior to May 20, make your way to the Imperial Hotel early this afternoon for check-in and optional church visits.

Individual arrivals into Copenhagen's Kastrup Airport. After baggage collection, emerge into the arrival hall in Terminal 3. Look for a driver with sign listing "MPR Pipedreams group". Most people are arriving in the 11am hour, so the transfer will take place after the 11:40am flight arrivals (approx. 12:30pm). Minibus/ small coach transfer from airport to your hotel. If your room is not ready yet, the hotel can hold your bags for you.

1:15pm Coach transfer from hotel to the first church visit.

1:30pm Garrison church's organ; demonstration by Hans Fagius, who will be with the group on the tour

Organ: a famous reconstruction by Carsten Lund of the organ built for the church 1724. Large instrument III/P with 44 stops. Excellent Bach organ.



3:00pm Trinitatis Church choir concert, followed by a 4pm demonstration by Hans Fagius (ends 5:15–5:30)

Organs: large organ by Marcussen & Søn/ P.G.Andersen, III/P, 53 stops, and an Italian instrument from ca. 1770, I/P, 13 stops.

Group will walk together back to the hotel (approx. 17 min).

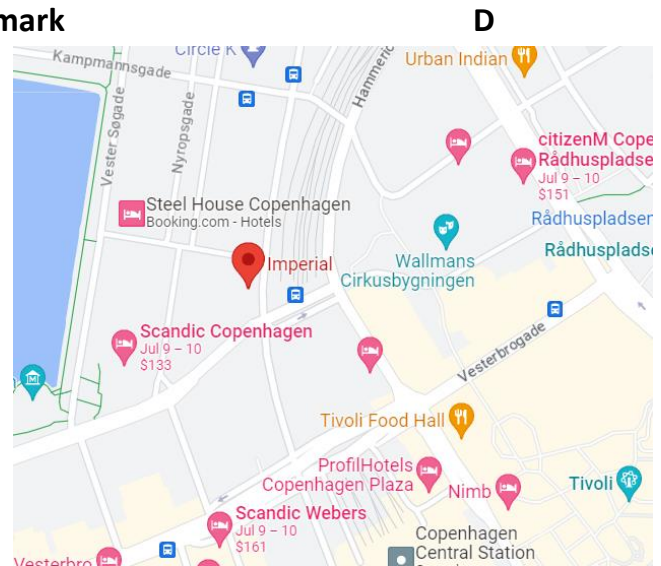

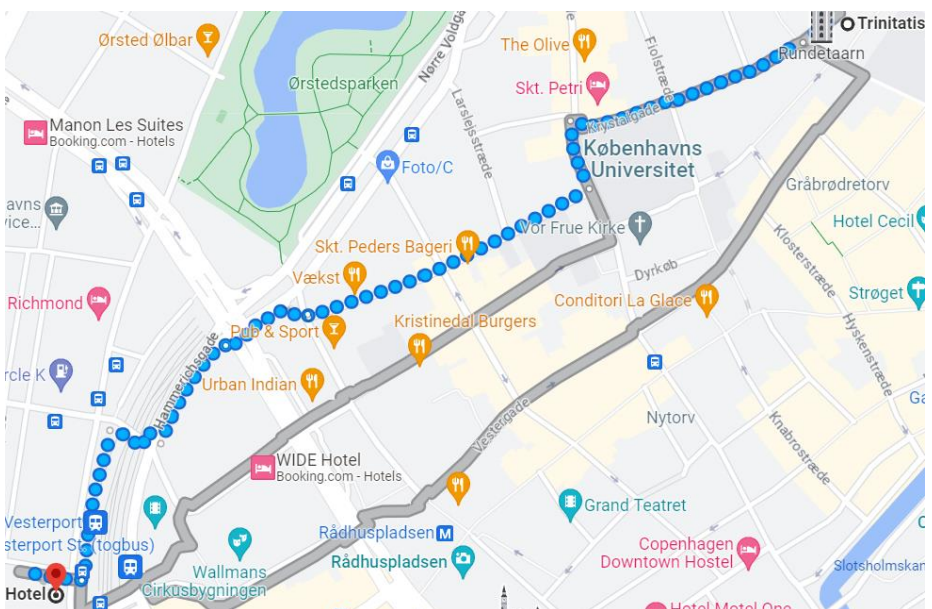

Organ: Hans Christoph Fritzsch 1661, the old organ from St. Petri Church. Case and some pipes from around 1500. Placed in Malmö museum 1938-41 by Frobenius with reconstructed Rückpositiv. Restored 2001-03, 21 stops, II/P.

4:00pm Guided tour through the art collection

5:15pm Check in at hotel. Porter Service - bags in.

6:15pm St Johannes church, Malmö - organ demonstration by Hans Fagius. Church visit ends 7:45pm.

Organ: Åkerman & Lund 2008, 59 stops, III/P. Excellent French/Swedish symphonic
