CMORNING STAR RADIANT LOVE

The writers of the New Testament employ a range of metaphors to describe Jesus. He is God's very word, a rock, and a bridegroom. He is the Alpha and the Omega. He is a potter and we are his clay. Each earthy image tells us something about Jesus and something about ourselves. They act as an invitation into a creative theological enterprise.

It is not only followers of Christ who use such figures of speech. Jesus himself offers seven "I am" statements in the Gospel of John. Each declaration employs a metaphor: I am the bread of life. I am the light of the world. I am the good shepherd, the true vine, and the resurrection and the life. I am the way, the truth, and the life. I am the gate for my sheep. These words act as a promise: Jesus holds power over death. They provide hope: Jesus nourishes and protects. They are at once simple and profound: Jesus is life. Alone, they are insufficient. Jesus is more than bread and light; yet, together they still only offer a glimpse of our knowable, but indescribable, God.

In Revelation, Jesus says, "I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star." As the morning star, Jesus ushers in a new day — a new creation when we long for rebirth. As the morning star, Jesus shines light into our darkness, and hope into our despair. Like the North Star guiding sailors, we fix our course upon the morning star.

What does it mean to set our sights on the morning star? It is to first receive the radiant love of God and to then share that very radiant love with others. The author of I John writes, "Beloved, let us love one another, because love is from God; everyone who loves is born of God and knows God. Whoever does not love does not know God, for God is love. God's love was revealed among us in this way: God sent his only Son into the world so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another."
