

INSTRUMENT EXPLORATION: Flute

Age Range:ElementaryLearning Objective:Students will learn to identify the flute by sight and sound.

ENGAGE students

ASK. "Look at the picture of a flute. Can you describe it? What do you think it looks like?"



EXPLORE sounds

- LEARN. "Listen to Karen from e(L)ement as she tells you a little about the flute."
- ASK. "The flute is a member of the woodwind family, but it's not made of wood! Can you explain why the flute is a member of the woodwind family?"
- LISTEN. <u>"Listen to this piece of music</u> featuring flute and harp. As you listen, think of three words that describe the sound of the flute."
- REFLECT. Instruct students to compare the sound of the flute with the sound of the harp. Have students either write down their thoughts or share them with a classmate.

EXTEND learning

Choose one or more activities to extend learning.

- CREATE. <u>Make a flute</u> with your class using PVC pipe and power tools.
- LEARN. Listen to flutes from different time periods in this <u>8-minute video</u> featuring Deb Harris of the Concordia Wind Quintet.
- MOVE. Expose students to a musical score during <u>this flute solo</u>. Demonstrate following the high and low notes on the screen to trace the melody in the air with their finger.
- LISTEN. <u>Listen to pop singer Lizzo</u> play flute with the NY Philharmonic.
